Michael Wall, M.D. is a professor of Neurology and Ophthalmology at the University of Iowa. His undergraduate and medical school education was at Tulane University; his neurology residency at Washington University in St. Louis and fellowship at Massachusetts Eye and Ear infirmary.

As a neuro-ophthalmologist he is involved in patient care, teaching and research. He is the author of 114 peer-reviewed journal articles and three books. He has been involved in idiopathic intracranial hypertension research for 30 years including being the Principle Investigator on the Idiopathic Intracranial Hypertension Treatment Trial completed in 2014. He is currently the Study Director of the NIH funded Surgical Intracranial Hypertension Treatment Trial (SIGHT). He is also the Principle Investigator of the VA Merit Review "Testing of the far Peripheral Visual Field – Obtaining the Full View." With this grant he has developed clinically applicable threshold automated perimetry of the full visual field.
