

Dr. Matt Schlenker is a Cataract, Glaucoma, and Anterior Segment Surgeon and Researcher at University Health Network, Kensington Eye Institute, and Trillium Health Partners. He is a Clinician Scientist at the Institute for Better Health, Trillium Health Partners and an Associate Professor at the University of Toronto Department of Ophthalmology & Vision Sciences.

He grew up on a farm near Medicine Hat, AB, obtained his Economics B.A. *Magna Cum Laude* from Yale University, worked for Bear Stears and McKinsey & Co, and pursued a Masters in Epidemiology at Harvard University. Research interests include observational study design and big data projects related to functional outcomes following cataract and glaucoma surgery, glaucoma surgery comparative analysis, glaucoma and cataract outcome predictive modeling, incorporating patient reported outcomes into shared decision making for appropriateness and prioritization in cataract surgery, and other eye health economics topics.

He is the Chair of Resident Research in the Department of Ophthalmology & Vision Sciences. He is a GAASS Fellow preceptor. He is a regular presenter at both local and international Academic conferences and has published in Ophthalmology, American Journal of Ophthalmology, British Journal of Ophthalmology, Journal of Cataract and Refractive Surgery, Canadian Medical Association Journal, among other journals.
